Working with the Police

Our Top Ten Tips for Security and Crime Prevention this Winter

Winter darkness gives thieves and burglars the perfect cover for their criminal activities, especially burglary and car crime. Take extra measures to keep your homes and vehicles secure.

- 1. A well-lit house gives the impression that someone is at home and helps deter opportunistic burglars, so:
 - Leave lights on if you are out in the evening;
 - Use timer switches to turn lights (and other electrical appliances such as radios) on when you are away
 from home. For remote control use a system such as V-Tac Smart Light and App to switch lights on and
 off, and to dim them.
- **2. Lock** your doors and windows every time you leave the house; remember to double-lock any UPVC doors (lift handle and turn the key).
- **3.** Make sure side and garden gates are locked to prevent access to the rear of your property.
- 4. Don't leave valuables (and presents at Christmas) in clear view through ground floor windows.
- 5. Don't leave keys (including car keys and fobs) on view in hallways and downstairs rooms. Hide them away.
- **6.** If you don't have it already, install good outside **security lighting**; and consider **early warning systems**, such as **Ring**, **Nest or CCTV cameras**, to alert you to intruders on your property.
- **7.** If you have a burglar alarm make sure you set it when you go out and before you go to bed; if you don't have an alarm system, consider installing one.
- **8.** Mark your valuables with your postcode and house number; register your property for free with www.immobilise.com or sign up with SmartWater (www.smartwater.com).
- **9.** Don't leave **tools** outside the house where they could be used to break into your house; make sure that ladders are secured; check that garden sheds are securely locked.
- **10.** Thefts from, and of, cars are common in Cockfosters, so:
 - Make sure your car is locked when you leave it;
 - Don't leave any valuables in the car, not even loose change or sunglasses;
 - Use a steering wheel lock each time you leave your car, especially if it has keyless entry; install an immobiliser the 'Ghost' system is highly recommended;
 - Keep keyless entry fobs (including spares) in a Faraday bag to stop their signals being picked up by car thieves.
